# EYFS

60% of EYFS children eligible for PP funding achieved the ELG which is in line with national.

### Year 1 Phonics

62.5% of PP eligible pupils achieved the expected standard in the yr1 phonics test which is less than that seen nationally. although small numbers of pupils do affect data interpretation. Year 2 SATS

Attainment in KS1 is less than national in English (Reading and Writing) with maths outcomes being in line with national.

## Year 6 SATS

100% of PP eligible pupils achieved expected standard in R,W & M exceeding the levels seen nationally.

Positive progress scores were achieved in R,W &M with progress in writing being well above that seen nationally, with a progress score of 4.81.
