# **Vision and Values**

This term, the children will be learning about the value of 'Respect'. The key message that the children will be learning about is that Respect is caring enough to consider how words and actions impact others. Having respect is when you feel good about someone because of how they act. Showing respect is when you care how your actions impact others.

### **First Holy Communion**

On Sunday, five of our children celebrated their First Holy Communion with family and friends at church. It is such a special event in their lives as Holy Communion is one of the Sacraments of Initiation into the Catholic Church - Baptism and Confirmation being the other two. # Safeguarding - WhatsApp

It has come to light that a number of children are using the 'WhatsApp' app to communicate with their friends in group chats. For those of you who do not know, the minimum age of use for WhatsApp is 16 years old. It had previously dropped to 13 years old, but in April 2018 returned to 16, as a response to data-protection legislation. Unfortunately, WhatsApp can bring issues of cyberbullying as children think because they are not at school, they are free to say what they like. However, the school has a legal obligation to investigate any incidents which have been brought to the attention of the school.



### Safeguarding - Mobile Phones when driving

Please could parents ensure that they are not using their mobile phones when driving into the car park/drop off zone. Being distracted whilst driving on the school premises could potentially cause a nasty accident if a child were to run out in front of the car and the driver is not paying attention. If the issue continues, I shall be raising the matter with the parents concerned. Your support will be greatly appreciated to ensure ALL members of our school community are kept safe.

# **Family Mass**

Bishop Patrick McKinney will celebrate a Mass for the families of the Diocese of Nottingham to coincide with the World Meeting of Families in Rome. Our Lady of Lincoln Parish will host the Mass 4.00pm on 25th June 2022 and invite you and your family to join them in celebrating this wonderful occasion. The choir of Our Lady of Lincoln Primary School will provide the music of the Mass and it will be a great occasion to invite friends and family with children who may have not been to Mass in a while.

Following the celebration of the Mass there will be a social gathering for families in the connecting grounds of Our Lady of Lincoln Parish and School. There will be a Barbeque, live music, families games, access to the schools play equipment, an ice cream van and most importantly the opportunity to socialise with other Catholic families from across the diocese. #### Mass - Feast of St Peter and St Paul - 29th June

To celebrate the Feast of St Peter and St Paul, as a Holy Day of Obligation, the whole school will be attending Mass at church. Saint Peter was a fisherman before Jesus called him to follow him. The children will know him as one of the fishermen who were called by Jesus to 'follow Him'. He was previously known as Simon. Peter was present during the major events of Jesus's ministry. Jesus entrusted Peter with a very special task, appointing him the leader of the Church. With the help of the Holy Spirit, he encouraged the early Christians to spread the Gospel message to people of all nations. He was named 'Petros' a Greek name, meaning 'rock'.

After Jesus Christ, St Paul is often considered the most important person in the history of Christianity. He was one of the leaders of the first Christians. Paul's life and his writings make up 13 of the 27 books of the New Testament in the Bible. These books play a large role in the development of Christian beliefs. The children will know that Paul was previously called 'Saul' and was blinded on the road to Damascus. It was here that God enabled Saul to see 'the light of truth'. After this experience, he was convinced that Jesus was the Messiah. From that day on, he used the name Paul and became one of the greatest missionaries of all time.
