Dear Parents, Carers and Children

A warm welcome to our new children and staff

I would like to wish a very warm welcome to our new Year Reception children as they embark on the first steps of their learning journey. We also welcome children into Year 1, Year 4 and Year 6 as they join the school. We hope they will be very happy here with us!

We are very excited to have them as part of our school team and all look forward to supporting and providing the best education for the children of Our Lady's.

Uniform

It was so lovely to see the children return to school – like shiny new pins – dressed very smartly in their uniforms. As you know, our school uniform is very important to us as it reflects our values and reinforces our school's culture of high expectations and academic achievement. It also helps to promote a sense of community and belonging and pride in our school. As a reminder, the school uniform consists of:

- a royal blue 'v' neck jumper or cardigan
- a white stiff- collared short-sleeved or long-sleeved shirt
- charcoal grey trousers/shorts for boys
- charcoal grey pinafore/skirt/trousers for girls
- white, grey or black socks/tights NOT brightly coloured patterned
- black school shoes NOT trainers
- stud earring only NOT hoops.

I appreciate in this current economic climate that the school logoed uniform is expensive and would like to remind you that logoed uniform is not a necessity, should you need to replace it. All I ask is that it is reflective of the school colours. If you are experiencing any financial difficulties, please do not hesitate to contact me directly.

PE Kits for September

EYFS and KS1 - If your child is in EYFS or KS1, we would like you to send in their PE kit at the start of the term, in their PE bags. Their kit will be kept in school until the end of each term. Throughout COVID, the children have mostly lost the ability to dress independently and many are requiring support. In order to address this problem, children should arrive to school in their uniform EVERY day. On the days when they have PE, they will practise the skills of getting changed/unchanged, as part of their learning journey, as we feel this is a vital part of their development.

KS2 - If your child is in KS2, we would like them to continue wearing their PE kits to school on the days they have PE. We have limited storage space in the classrooms and lack of space for the children to get changed separately, to protect their dignity. Please could I ask that the children DO NOT wear hoodies/jumpers that are branded with sports brands. Please do not send them into school wearing blue, black, pink, green or red t-shirts - only plain white/logoed white t-shirts will be accepted. I shall contact parents to bring alternative clothing to school for their child to get changed into. Your help and understanding on this matter is greatly appreciated.

PLEASE ENSURE ALL UNIFORM ITEMS ARE LABELLED OR NAMED TO PREVENT LOSS. IF YOUR CHILD'S UNIFORM IS NAMED, BUT MISPLACED, IT WILL BE RETURNED TO YOUR THEM!

Attendance

As mentioned at the end of the last academic year, this year will bring about a big focus on attendance in school. Attendance figures for last year show that there were a large number of children with attendance below 90%, which is classed as persistent absence. Each month, I shall be monitoring attendance and speak to parents where their child's attendance is starting to become a concern. I appreciate that there may be times that your child/ren are poorly and this will be taken into consideration. Please note that no holidays will be authorised and it will be listed as unauthorised absence. Please do not book any holidays during term time as this has a huge impact on your child's learning potential.


Information from The School Run (https://www.theschoolrun.com/parents-guide-school-attendance) states:

Missing a few days of school here and there may not seem a big deal, but research shows that it can have a significant impact on children's learning. Children who miss a substantial amount of school fall behind their peers, and struggle to catch up. Most of the work they miss is never made up, which can lead to big gaps in their learning.

Poor attendance often starts at primary school, and children who fall into this pattern are likely to underachieve at secondary school. Pupils who miss between 10 and 20% of school (that's 19 to 38 days per year) stand only a 35% chance of achieving five or more good GCSEs, compared to 73% of those who miss fewer than 5% of school days.

Friendships can be affected by persistent absence, too: it can be hard for a child who misses lots of school to form relationships with their classmates.

Poor attendance also reflects badly on your child's school. Ofsted expect all schools to have good attendance rates, and they are marked down in inspections if their absence figures are too high.



Safeguarding

Student Update Form - To ensure the safety of all our children in school, please could you ensure you check your child's 'Student Update Form' and make any necessary changes. Please could this form be signed and returned to school even if there are no changes to be made. It is vital we have the correct information and contact numbers should we need to contact you.

Medical Form - If your child has a medical condition that the school needs to be aware of, or if their current condition has changed in anyway, please could you inform the school at your earliest convenience. Please note that a new Care Plan needs to be signed each year. Mrs Hunt will be contacting you shortly.

Nut Allergy - Please be aware that we have two children in school with a nut allergy. Please could I ask that children DO NOT bring in any raw nuts, whole nuts etc in their packed lunches. This is a potential matter of life or death for two of our children and I know, like me, you will appreciate the need to reduce the risk of contamination to protect them.


Home/School Agreement - Please could you read the Home/School Agreement document and sign, where necessary, giving your consent for your child to go on local school trips. Also, please could you ensure that you complete the 'Permission to Collect' form with the names of those who are able to collect your child/ren from school. There were a number of occasions last year where adults not on the collection list came to collect a child and staff had to contact parents to seek permission for their child to be dismissed. Unfortunately, whilst many people appreciate the need for the school to do this, as part of the safeguarding of your children, there were a couple of instances where staff received abuse for doing so.

Acceptable IT Use Agreements- Please could you support your child to read and understand the information printed on the KS1 and KS2 to ensure they understand their responsibility when using IT devices in school and how to keep themselves safe whilst doing so.

Walking Home Alone Policy - If your child is in Y6, they will have brought home a 'Walking Home Alone Policy'. Should you wish your child to develop their independence, in readiness for starting secondary school, please could you read the policy with them and sign to say that they have permission to walk to and from school alone. Without this permission slip being completed, they will NOT be able to walk alone.

Mobile Phones - If your child is in Y6 and you wish for them to be contactable on a mobile phone, if walking to and from school alone, please complete the permission slip.

Please could all permission forms and update forms be returned to the office by Friday, 9th September. Many thanks.



Reading

As you know, Reading is a high priority on the school agenda. In order for your child/ren to be able to access the curriculum, it is vital that they are able to read with fluency and sight read high frequency words. Please could you ensure that either you, or another adult, listen to your child read as a minimum of 3 times per week. Please don't forget to sign their Reading Record! For those children who read, on average, 3 times per week over the term will receive a Reading Certificate, to be awarded in the final Celebration Liturgy of them term.

To develop their comprehension skills and to make sense of what they have read, please ask them questions about the text they have read. I shall be holding a Reading Workshop later in the term for parents who wish to improve how they can best support their children with Reading at home.

Homework

Each week, your child/ren will come home with homework to support learning in school. This will usually consist of reading as a minimum of three times per week, TimesTablesRockStars (Y1 - Y6) and spellings. Please support your children as much as you can to learn their multiplication tables and their spellings.

Maths in Year 5 and Y6 is reliant on the children knowing their multiplication tables. If they don't know them, or are not confident in knowing them, Maths can get particularly tricky! If your child is going in to Year 4, they will be expected to take the Y4 Multiplication Check in June. This is a statutory test, set by the government, in which they are expected to know all of the multiplication tables up to and including 12 x 12. The pass mark is 25 and the children have 6 seconds to answer each question. Please support your child to learn their tables – thank you!



Please support your child to practise spellings using joined up, cursive handwriting.

Advent 1 Curriculum Overview - Year Reception

Subject	Curriculum	Overview
English	Talk for Writing	Fiction – The Jolly Postman. This term the children will be spending a lot of time settling in, getting to know their classmates and learning the rules and the routines of the school. We will begin to learn some key 'Talk for Writing' actions, and practise using our story-teller voices, as we learn to recite the story 'The Jolly Postman'.
	Spelling	This term, the children will begin to learn their set 1 sounds. They will also be using 'Fred Talk' to orally segment sounds and blend them together; "c-a-t cat!"
	Grammar	As part of their Talk for Writing lessons, the children will be learning about adjectives and sequencing words.
Maths	Measure	The children will begin their Maths learning by completing the Reception Baseline Assessment. After this they will move on to matching and sorting objects, comparing size, mass and capacity, and exploring pattern.
	Number	The children will also be learning about Numberblocks 1-5 and comparing different amounts.
RE	Domestic Church- Family. 'Myself'	The children will be learning about the importance of their name and how special they are. They will be learning that God knows them, and everyone around them, by their name. This is a great first topic for helping the children to get to know one-another and learn everybody's name.
	Baptism- Belonging. 'Welcome'	The class will then move on to learn about Baptism. They will talk about different ways to welcome somebody, including in different languages, and they will say what it means to them to be made to feel welcome. After this the children will learn about the sacrament of Baptism, during which they will enjoy acting out a Baptism in small groups.
Topic	People Who Help Us!	This term the children will be learning about a range of different people who help us all. They will start by talking about the people within their own family who have helped them every day of their lives, before moving on to learn who each of the key people in school are that will help them throughout the school year. The children will then learn about different occupations and the important jobs that these people have; postal workers, firefighters, dentists and doctors.
PSHE	New Beginnings	The children's PSHE learning this term focuses on developing the children's knowledge, understanding and skills in four key social and emotional aspects of learning: empathy, self-awareness, social skills and motivation.

English	Talk for Writing	T4W Fiction – Warning Tale – Goldilocks and the Three Bears T4W Non-fiction – Recount Letter – Letter to Baby Bear
	Spelling	This term, the children will continue to learn the Year 1 Common exception words as well as words they have been spelling during phonics and topic lessons.
	Grammar	As part of Talk for Writing, the children will continue using full stops, finger spaces and capital letters as well as learning about adjectives and verbs.
Maths	Place Value (to 50) and Number	The children will focus on the value of each digit in the tens and one's column to 50.
	Addition and Subtraction	The children will find the total amount by adding and subtracting using tens and ones, as well as a number line.
RE	Family	Children will explore how we are all God's children, God loves us all and recognise who is in our family. Children will understand what the psalms tells us about God's love and care.
DT	Puppets	Children will explore different ways of joining fabrics together in order to design how they would create a puppet. The children will draw and label their puppet design, based on Goldilocks and the Three Bears, in preparation for making their product.
Music	Introducing Beat - How Can We Make Friends when we sing together?	During music this term, the children will learn and sing the song 'Bring us Together'. Throughout the weeks, the children will begin to use musical instruments to prepare the song for performing.
PE	PE 1 – Games for	The children will know how to apply simple attacking and defending
	Understanding principles into a game situation. During both these topics, children will learn how to set up equipment putting away safely.	
	PE 2 – Gymnastics	To know how to apply 'champion gymnastics' to explore movements and balances on the floor and on apparatus, using combinations of the following words; big, small, wide, narrow, curled.
PSHE	Fun Times	This topic focuses on how we look after our skin in the sun, different playground games from across the years, special foods and cultures and who can help us when playing outside.
Science	Animals, including humans.	Children will explore the 5 senses the human body has and their functions. They will undergo a variety of experiments where they will record and compare their findings. The children will explore their senses through tasting foods, feeling different materials and substances, smelling a variety of products, listening to inside and outside sounds as well as using their sight to predict what liquids are before tasting or smelling.
History	Toys – Past and Present	Children will identify different characteristics of toys by comparing modern day toys to the past. Using this knowledge, they will label the characteristics which will support their designs of their toy museum.

Art	Paint, Surface, Texture – Mixed Media Land and City Scapes	This term the children will be learning about landscape painter Vanessa Gardiner and The Shoreditch Sketcher through the discovery of Mixed Media Landscapes and City Scapes. Alongside this they will get creative using watercolours and Philip Wilson Steers use of whitewash.
French	Do you have an animal?	During this topic, the children will learn the different names for animals in French. They will learn how to say that they have a pet and what type of pet they have.
History	The Romans	In this unit, the children will find out about The Romans and what happened to them when they came to Britain. They will discover who lead the Romans and their impact on Britain.
IT	Computing systems and networks – Systems and searching	The children will be learning about the different types of computing systems and networks. They will also learn about search engines and how searches are influenced and ranked.
Music	Samba drums	This term the children will be learning about how music brings us together through the Samba drums including how to play the instrument from the professionals.
PE	PE 1 - Dance	During this topic, the children will be learning about movement and becoming a character particularly an astronaut and how they move around when they are in space.

	Spelling	During the term, the children will be revising the Year 5/6 statutory words in preparation for the SATs spelling practice tests. This term, the children will practise adding suffixes to the beginning and
		ending of words with vowels.
Maths	Number - Place Value Number - Addition and Subtraction Multiplication and Division Multiplication Tables	This term, the children will be recapping and expanding their knowledge of place value with numbers up to 10,000,000. The children will also be revisiting addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, and use their problem solving skills. The children will continue to practise their Times Tables both in school and at home.
RE	Loving	During this topic, the children will be exploring how love can be shown in different ways such as forgiveness and how we can show people unconditional love and care. The children will also be making links to God and the Prodigal Son, as well as Christian beliefs and values when it comes to love and forgiveness.
	Vocation and Commitment	The children will be learning how we have different commitments in our lives and what it means to make a commitment. We will also be exploring how religion/beliefs can shape the types of commitments in people's lives and lead them down different paths/journeys.
