Statement from Bishop Patrick McKinney, Bishop of Nottingham, on the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

On behalf of the Catholic Community here in Nottingham and across much of the East Midlands, we wish to express our deep sadness at hearing the news of the death of Her Majesty the Queen. I wish to take this opportunity to express our gratitude and love for the late Queen. We have always admired her deep sense of duty, service, and commitment, but also her very evident love for the people she has served so generously these last 71 years.

We also want to pay our respects to the Queen as a woman of a faith, as a Christian, whose faith always inspired and shaped the way she lived. We pray that Christ Jesus, whom she faithfully served throughout her whole life, may now welcome her into His Kingdom with these words: 'Well done good and faithful servant.' Our prayers go out to her family at this very sad time for them, as well as the whole nation. God save the King.

During this time of national mourning, Nottingham Cathedral will open daily (from 7am-7pm) for people to sign the book of condolence, to light a candle and to spend some time in private prayer or reflection. All are welcome.

Almighty God, You are the author and sustainer of all human life; grant that your servant, Elizabeth our Queen, whom you granted a long and happy reign as Monarch of these lands may be forgiven her sins and rewarded with that eternal life promised to all those born again in the water of baptism and power of your Spirit. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit God, forever and ever, Amen.

Eternal rest grant unto her, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon her. May she rest in peace.

May her soul, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen

Statement to Live By

'Statements to Live By' are a resource, used in school, which has been developed by the diocese to help the children, and all of us adults too, to think about who we are, what we believe and what we hope to become. There are 36 statements in all which are linked to our Religious Education programme and the Catholic life of the school, but each one is relevant no matter what our religious beliefs are.

Each week, I shall share a different statement, such as 'I try to be just and fair', with you. Each statement is displayed in every classroom and around the school, and introduced and explained to the children, usually through an assembly. Children are encouraged to think about the statement at the beginning of the school day – it is then reinforced throughout the day, explored in collective worship and reflected upon before going home.

Over the next few weeks the children will be working together to....

'Understand their uniqueness as made in the image of God and develop self awareness, positive self-esteem and confidence'.

Please take the opportunity to discuss with your child at home and support them as they learn about....

- We are all special
- I can say one good thing about myself
- I can say how I feel
- I can laugh and have fun

What makes them special and what makes mum/dad/carer special?

This week's Statement to Live By is, **'I can say one good thing about myself'**. Please support and encourage your child/ren, throughout the week, to recognise something positive about their themselves: appearance, their qualities, or maybe the gifts and talents God has given them.

Women's, teenagers and children's clothing.

Blankets, sheets and mattress protectors, electrolyte powder and food.

Food should have long shelf life and not need refrigeration. For example, rice, pasta and sauces, oats, pulses and anything tinned.
