Statement to Live By

This week's Statement to Live By is 'I know what to do if I see someone being hurt' as part of helping the children to 'know, appreciate and understand the importance of social justice and develop independence, interdependence and responsibility'. This statement links to the new Sacramental topic in RE of Baptism and Confirmation.

Over the past few weeks in school, the children have been revisiting the school's Mission Statement – please see below. In doing so, each class has created their own 'Class Charter' which is a set of class rules that each child has agreed to abide by. This area of learning has enabled the children to think about how they act with others within the classroom and take responsibility of their words and actions. As a whole school, during Collective Worship, the children have had the opportunity for discussion about what to do in situations where they may see someone being hurt – either through words or actions. As part of the school's anti-bullying drive, the children know that they need to speak up and support their friends and if it doesn't stop, to speak to the adults in school or parents at home.

Please support your child/ren this week to talk about they would do in a situation where someone was being hurt.

To Love, Live and Learn in the Light of Christ

The Our Lady family learn together with love and faith in Jesus, to become the people God calls us to be.

Our School is part of the Church's Mission to pass on the good news of Christ's Gospel through learning, worship and the formation of character in a caring environment, which embodies Christian values and discipline. God has created every child out of love and the human dignity of each will be rightfully valued and respected.

Our School community will embrace a spirit of welcome, fairness and understanding as it strives to recognise God's Grace within each of us and within our whole community.

October - Month of the Rosary

The Catholic Church traditionally dedicates October as the Month of The Rosary. The liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7th.

The word 'Rosary' means a chain of roses and the roses are prayers. The Rosary Prayer tells us about the life of Jesus and his Mother, Mary. There are four sets of "mysteries" or events from four periods of Jesus's life.

First, there are the "Joyful Mysteries". These are the events around the birth of Jesus. The five Joyful Mysteries are:

- the Annunciation;
- the Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth;
- the birth of Jesus;
- the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple;
- the Finding of the boy Jesus

Then, there are the "Sorrowful Mysteries". There are the events that surround the death of Jesus. They are:

- the Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane;
- the Scourging;
- the Crowning with Thorns;
- Jesus carries the Cross;
- the Crucifixion and death of Jesus.

Next, there are the "Glorious Mysteries". These are the events following the Resurrection of Jesus. They are:

- the Resurrection of Jesus;
- the Ascension of Jesus into heaven;
- the day of Pentecost and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit;
- the Assumption of Mary into heaven;
- Mary as the Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Finally, there are the "Mysteries of Light or the Luminous Mysteries". These mysteries were introduced by Pope John Paul II and are events from the public ministry of Jesus. They are:

- the Baptism of Jesus;
- the Wedding Feast at Cana;
- the Proclamation of the Kingdom of Heaven;
- the Transfiguration;
- the Last Supper.

Across the Nottinghamshire Diocese, Bishop Patrick is keen for the children to complete the 'Rosary Challenge for October'. Throughout the month, the children will be praying the Rosary in school. Please find attached a copy of the Mark 10 Mission Rosary Challenge that you may wish to use at home to support your children to pray the Rosary.

Reading

Over the last few weeks, teaching staff have been monitoring each child's engagement with reading at home through their Reading Records. It has been noted that a large number of children are not reading the minimum of three times per week to an adult at home. As part of the Home/School Agreements, returned earlier in September, it states that parents will support their child/ren with homework tasks, including Reading.

To help us track how much reading your child is are doing at home, it is important that you sign their reading record every time you have listened to them read, along with a brief comment. Your support with reading at home is essential and only by working together can we ensure your child achieves their potential as a reader. Supporting early reading in EYFS and KS1 is vitally important. Early reading ignites creativity, sparks curiosity, and stimulates the imagination in young children. It also supports their speaking skills in being able to pronounce the words they read correctly. Often, older children who are left to read alone, without the support of an adult, have misconceptions as to how particular words are read and need to be corrected. Moreover, those children who read regularly and are exposed to a range of texts have a better vocabulary range and can apply this to their writing.

Please could I ask that parents/carers read a minimum of three times per week If *you* require any support with reading, please do contact me and I shall endeavour to help you.

- Make the Sign of the Cross and pray "The Apostles' Creed."
- 2. Pray the "Our Father."
- 3. Pray 3 "Hail Marys."
- Pray the "Glory Be To The Father."

5. Announce the First Mystery, then pray the "Our Father."

- Pray 10 "Hail Marys," while meditating on the First Mystery.
- Pray the "Glory Be To The Father."
- Announce the Second Mystery, then pray the "Our Father." Repeat 6 & 7 and continue with the Third, Fourth and Fifth Mysteries in the same manner.
- After completing the fifth Mystery, pray the "Hail, Holy Queen" on the center medal.
