

Statement to Live By

This week's Statement to Live By is 'I can tell how to look after myself' as part of helping the children to 'Grow towards human wholeness and develop a healthy life style in the body, mind and spirit and understand the connection between knowledge and living'.

This week, please take the time to speak to your child about how they can look after themselves. Ask them why it is important to keep healthy. You may wish to discuss healthy eating, exercise, mental well-being, how to look after themselves whilst online, whilst they are playing outside, stranger danger etc. These examples, and many more, are just some of the topics they learn about in school through a range of curriculum subjects.



This term's Value - Hope

Throughout the coming term, the Value which the whole school will be focusing on is 'Hope'. In the liturgical calendar, the season of Advent will soon be upon us. During this times, as Christians, we wait in the expectation and hope for the coming of the Messiah, the hope that the prophecies from the Old Testament will be fulfilled and the hope that one day, Jesus will come again.

The first candle on the Advent Wreath to be lit is the candle of 'hope' and with each additional candle lit, we eagerly await the 'light of the world'.

Children in Need

November is a very important month for us in school to support some important charities and focus on the importance of Missionary Discipleship, an important theme given to us by Bishop Patrick. It is a time in which we follow in Jesus's footsteps to go out and spread the Gospel message, doing good for others.

Children in Need takes place on Friday, 18th November. As part of our democracy work in school (linked to our British Values), we put three events to the children that they could choose from to raise money for this worthwhile cause. The choices included a non-uniform day, a bake sale or spotty games and the winner by a small margin was a bake sale.



Paper plates will be sent out next week, on Tuesday 15th, for cakes to be put on and brought back into school on the Friday. It is up to you whether they are baked or shop bought- we don't mind but would love your support. We kindly ask that on the Friday, children bring a monetary donation to buy a cake, which we will have available to them at break time. We hope that we will have enough cakes for sale at the end of the day for you to buy too and may even be able to have an auction with some of the bigger cakes. We will send a text out on the day to let you know if this happens so that you can come along and join in the bidding!
