Advent 2 - Curriculum Overview – Year 6

Subject	Curriculum	Overview
English	Talk for Writing	Fiction - Flashback - Kidnapped: Our first Talk for Writing unit this term will allow the children to explore how to include a flashback scene in their piece of writing. The children will also be exploring the genre of action and the vocabulary that is used in action pieces of writing. Non-fiction - Report - The Arctic Frost Dragon: Our second Talk for Writing unit will allow children to write a report, focusing on describing a creature's appearance, habitat and living habits. The children will also explore descriptive vocabulary and will be including complex sentences in their writing.
	Spelling	During the term, the children will be revising the Year 5/6 statutory words in preparation for the SATs spelling practice tests and to include them into their writing.
	Grammar	This term, the children will be having weekly grammar lessons, exploring different areas each week to practise and expand on their prior knowledge. Grammar worksheets, based on what has been learnt in lesson, will also be sent home as part of their homework.
Maths	Number - Fractions A Number - Fractions B Measurement - Converting Units Multiplication Tables	This term the children will be recapping on their prior fractions knowledge and using their knowledge to add, subtract and multiply fractions, and solve multi-step problems. The children will continue to practise all of their Times Tables both in schoo and at home. They will also be having a monthly times tables test in
RE	Judaism	preparation for their SATs and to aid them in their maths lessons. Our alternative faith this term is Judaism. The children will be exploring
	Expectations	what happens at Rosh Hashanah and what Mikveh is. During this topic, the children will be exploring the expectations of Christian lives and how those expectations link to scripture about John's expectation of Jesus. We will also be exploring how expectations impact Christians around Advent time.
Art	Exploring Identity	Throughout our Art topic, we will be exploring the works of Njideka Akunyi Crosby, Yinka Shonibare, Mike Barrat and Thandiwe Muriu. The children wi be able to know who the artists are and compare their pieces of work. They will also be able to show their emotions and personalities through colour and fine details.
French	Regular Verbs	In our French topic, the children will be exploring how to use regular verbs to ask for clothes and to ask how much an item is. They will also be able to say which clothes they like to wear and give their opinions.
Geography	South America - The Amazon	For Geography, we will be exploring The Amazon in South America. The children will be able to locate The Amazon on the map and identify animals and tribes that are native to The Amazon. We will also be exploring the current damage that is being caused to The Amazon and what can be done to protect it.
Computing	Creating Media - 3D Modelling	This term's computing topic will identify how to work in three dimensions on a computer. The children will learn how to modify a 3D model and will be able to create their own 3D model for a purpose.
PE	Swimming	The children will be continuing with their swimming sessions each Friday. There are no other PE days for the rest of the term, only swimming.
PSHE	Keeping Safe - Out and About	For our PSHE topic this term, the children will be exploring the dangers of peer pressure when outside in their local area. We will be identifying behaviours of someone who may be doing things due to peer pressure. The children will also be learning about consequences for anti-social behaviour and where to go if they need help.
Science	Evolution and Inheritance - The Game of Survival	This term, we will be focusing on biology for science and our main scientist for this topic will be Darwin, Anning and Wallace. During this topic, we will be identifying different characteristics that we as humans have and how no human is identical due to our environmental and inherited characteristics. The children will also be exploring how, through evolution, humans, anima and plants adapt to their environment.
