Statement to Live By

This week's Statement to Live By is 'I try to love others as I love myself' as part of helping the children to 'Experience a sense of belonging within a range of communities, including the local Eucharistic Community, and play an active role as members of society'.

The meaning for this week's Statement to Live By can be found in Matthew's Gospel - Matthew 22:36-39.

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.'

In Jesus's commandment, He taught us that it is not about asking who our neighbour is. Rather, it is about our own willingness to be a neighbour ready to love. In the parable of the Good Samaritan, it teaches us that our neighbour can even be a complete stranger who we can expect nothing from in return. The commandment means being a neighbour to everyone, and most importantly it is about us being that good neighbour. It starts with ourselves.

This week, ask your children how they can be a good neighbour to others.
