The Holy Father Pope Francis asks that Monday 7th October, the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary, to be a day of fasting and prayer for peace in the world. Accordingly, Bishop Patrick, together with all the Bishops across England and Wales, is asking parishes to do all they can to both inform parishioners of this message and request from the Holy Father, and to help as many as possible to participate in this action, calling for the gift of peace wherever there is conflict.

In addition, the Holy Father will recite the Holy Rosary on Sunday at the Basilica of Sta Maria Maggiore. It would be opportune to invite parishioners also to recite the Rosary this coming Sunday, invoking Our Lady Queen of Peace, and uniting their prayer with that of the Pope.

The Rosary is prayed every day before morning Mass in our parish. Please make every effort to attend on Monday 7th October. The rosary begins at 09.45.
