

Jubilee 2025



2025 has been designated as a Jubilee Year by Pope Francis. We are all invited to enter into a special year of forgiveness and reconciliation, strengthening our relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation. We have a wonderful opportunity to celebrate our Catholic faith during Jubilee 2025 – and we can do this in a wide variety of ways.

Which key dates are important for the Jubilee Year?

Pope Francis will launch the Jubilee Year by opening the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica in the Vatican on 24 December 2024. A Holy Door is one of the usually sealed entrances that lead into the major basilicas of Rome, which is only opened during a Jubilee Year. The Catholic Church celebrates a Jubilee Year, such as this, every 25 years. The Jubilee Year will open in the Diocese of Nottingham on 29 December 2024, with schools having a special day of their own on Friday 24 January. The Jubilee Year will close on 6 January 2026, the solemnity of The Epiphany.

Tuesday 24 December 2024

The Holy Father will open the Jubilee in Saint Peter's Basilica, Rome on Tuesday 24 December 2024.

The Jubilee closes with the solemnity of the Epiphany on Tuesday 6 January 2026.


Who are the Pilgrims of Hope?

The theme for the Jubilee year is Pilgrims of Hope – and we are those pilgrims. Pope Francis has invited Catholics to renew their hope and discover a vision that can "restore access to the fruits of the earth to everyone". We are urged to turn our gaze to the plight of our brothers and sisters across the world, and ensure that we observe and preserve human dignity for all. In addition, we are encouraged by Pope Francis, 'to contemplate the beauty of creation and care for our common home'.










What does the Jubilee Logo tell us?

The Jubilee logo is brimming with significance. What do you notice within? The diagram on the left unpacks the elements included within the design, reinforcing the concept of us all becoming Pilgrims of Hope in the coming year.



Will we undertake Jubilee Pilgrimages?

In 2015-2016, many of us may remember that we passed through a designated holy door in our schools and parishes: this Jubilee Year, we are invited, instead, to make pilgrimages, near or far. Nine churches in our own diocese will each be designated as a *Jubilee Church*, one located in each deanery. Here is a list of our diocesan Jubilee Churches:

What about Social Justice in the Jubilee Year?







We are all invited into an encounter with Jesus Christ, as his disciples of mercy, forgiveness, and as missionary disciples. We are called to take action, hopeful for a better future, where mercy guides what we do. It is a time for forgiveness and reconciliation within and beyond our communities. We can act to address injustices, support the vulnerable, and work towards a more equitable society. We are encouraged to embrace the spirit of the Jubilee and unite together, creating a world of compassion and justice, where everyone, everywhere, can grow and flourish.







How should we Celebrate the Jubilee Year?

Rather than doing too many extra things in the Jubilee, re-imagine what you currently do but use the theme of Jubilee. For example, speak of the 'Jubilee Week of Prayer for Christian Unity' and put the Jubilee logo on the prayer leaflet, rather than referring simply to the 'Week of Prayer for Christian Unity', or plan for Mass at the end of the academic year to have reference to the Jubilee in the title, and invitation, service itself and the corresponding service booklet

The Jubilee logo, the Jubilee prayer, and the Jubilee hymn should all be used frequently, and should be incorporated into activities such as

- any significant school anniversaries which fall during the Jubilee
- activities which help to link schools with their local parish(es) in the Jubilee
- mbedding the Jubilee prayer and hymn in the school's prayer during the year
