Key Information

Today, a member of the Stay Safe Partnership, delivered an Identity workshop to Year 6.

The workshop allows pupils to develop their understanding of Identity and Values.

Learning Objectives

Identity: To develop an understanding of our own identity.

Values: Look at personal values and how we reflect them.

Choices & Change: How choice and change can affect our identity.

Session Content



Defining identity and prioritising Values.



Identified scenarios of Peer Pressure.



Understanding the Locus of Control.



How control may affect relationships.

Things we covered...

Peer Pressure

A feeling that you must do the same thing as others, even if you know it is wrong, just to fit in.

Control

Where one person tells someone else what to do in an unhealthy manner, making you feel guilty, intimidated or insecure.

Locus of Control

It is okay to be unique.

Understanding the locus of control allows us to recognise we cannot control others' thoughts and actions, but we take responsibility for our own thoughts and actions.



How can you carry on the conversation?



Normalise conversations around healthy relationships and actively question and challenge unhealthy relationship behaviours.

Periodically watch what your children are engaging with on tv and apps – talk about how it makes them feel.

This should help them recognise peer pressure and controlling behaviour.
