### Our curriculum

At Our Lady of Good Counsel, we have developed an ambitious and engaging curriculum, which encourages our pupils to challenge themselves and grow as lifelong learners

It is designed and planned to ensure that pupils learn and encounter new knowledge sequentially. It also gives them many opportunities to revisit their learning to ensure that they learn more, know more and remember more.

We have a specialist music teacher and sports coaches who provide specialist coaching throughout the year. Our curriculum has been designed to reflect the world and community in which our children live and prepares them for life beyond education. We want all of our children to develop a love of learning which we stay with them throughout life.

### Teaching and learning

Our teachers ensure that every lesson is planned and delivered in a sequential way to avoid cognitive overload. Pupils are supported and challenged regardless of their ability in every subject area. Teachers track and assess the pupils' progress and use this to inform the next lesson and any support that is needed. Teachers adapt teaching to meet the needs of all pupils.

Every class is supported by a teaching assistant who provides group and individual support and challenge. Teachers and teaching assistants also support the mental health and welfare of the pupils.







Our school believes that we are all made in the image and likeness of God, with our own unique gifts and qualities and therefore God is present in everyone, irrespective of their religion, culture, nationality or financial background.

Catholic Social Teaching underpins all that we do in school. Our pupils know that we live our lives by the teachings of the Church and through the Gospel. Through this, pupils know how to live out their faith in the world. The Catholic Social Teaching principles incorporate dignity, solidarity, the common good, the option for the poor, peace, creation and environment and the dignity of work and participation.

Pupils recognise that there is inequality in the world and will raise money for a range of charities to support other communities.

Our pupils learn how to treat others in our parish community and our wider global family. As well as the weekly learning in the 'Statements to Live By', pupils learn about British Values. This supports the pupils' knowledge and understanding of inclusion and diversity.

## Beyond the curriculum

At Our Lady of Good Counsel we value the uniqueness of all our pupils and establish an ethos that develops the 'whole child'.

Our pupils are encouraged to take risks and build resilience. They are encouraged to be inquisitive lifelong learners who question and explore the world around them.

Our nurturing staff recognise and support a diversity of needs relating to learning, health, mental wellbeing, behaviour as well as emotional and physical requirements ensuring that all our pupils feel safe, secure and are able to aspire to be the very best they can be.

Developing the whole of

### Our Lady of Good Counsel aims to give all pupils the opportunity to attend extra-curricular clubs to develop skills or to introduce pupils to new sports.

Sports clubs are rotated each term to maximise the activities the pupils are encouraged to participate in. Examples of clubs offered are netball, football, athletics, dance, footgolf, and orienteering to name a few – all of which are free.

Through participation in these clubs, the pupils learn sporting values such as fairness, team building, equality, discipline, inclusion, perseverance and respect, which, in turn, contribute to the Catholic ethos of our school.

As a school that is rooted in supporting our pupils' mental health, our Emotional Literacy Support Assistants (ELSA) AND qualified Mental Health First Aiders support pupils and recognise that physical health contributes to positive mental health and well-being.

To support pupils academically, and for them to reach their full potential and be ready for the next stage of their learning journey, booster clubs are offered on an individual needs basis. These operate either at lunchtime or after school – again free of charge.

As a school, we recognise that working parents require childcare before and after school. Our Lady's provides a warm, caring, 'home-from-home' environment, offering wrap-around care from 7.45am until 5.45pm. Pupils are provided with breakfast and a nutritious hot or cold snack after school.

#### Achieving full potential and personal development

Mini Vinnies, Shining Stars and the School Council provide a voice for all in school. As a school, we contribute to the local community by getting involved in local issues such as litter picking and keeping the local area tidy.

We build relationships between the young and old by visiting local care homes to read to the residents and perform carols. We also write cards at Christmas and Easter to the local parishioners and residents in the local care homes. We contribute to CAFOD (Catholic Agency for Overseas Development) on a yearly basis by getting involved with their fundraising activities which help our fellow neighbours all over the world.

#### **Joining Our Lady of Good Counsel**

The window for Reception opens in November through to January. The Admissions Team will notify parents in April if they have been allocated Our Lady of Good Counsel as their school of choice. Following this, before starting school in Year Reception, there will be an opportunity for new pupils to visit and for parents and carers to attend an information meeting where they can ask any questions they may have.
